7. Exposition of the term dissociated by what is associated

306. The states that are by the aggregate of feeling... the states that are by the aggregate of perception... the states that are by the aggregate of mental activities... the states that are by the aggregate of consciousness... the states that are by the mind sense base associated, of those states whatever states are dissociated - by how many aggregates, by how many sense bases, by how many elements are those states dissociated? Those states are dissociated from four aggregates, from one sense base, from seven elements; from one sense base, from one element, dissociated from some.

307. The states that are by the eye-consciousness element... etc. the states that are by the mind-element... the states that are by the mind-consciousness element associated, of those states whatever states are dissociated... those states are dissociated not from any aggregates, not from any sense bases, from one element.

308. The states that are associated with the mind faculty, of those states whatever states are dissociated... those states are dissociated from four aggregates, from one sense base, from seven elements; from one sense base, from one element, dissociated from some.

309. The states that are associated with the equanimity faculty, of those states whatever states are dissociated... those states are dissociated not from any aggregates, not from any sense bases, from five elements.

310. With volitional activities as condition, the states that are by consciousness... the states that are by contact with the six sense bases as condition... the states that are by feeling with contact as condition... the states that are by contact... the states that are by feeling... the states that are by perception... the states that are by volition... the states that are by consciousness... the states that are by attention associated, of those states whatever states are dissociated... those states are dissociated from four aggregates, from one sense base, from seven elements; from one sense base, from one element, dissociated from some.

311. The states that are by decision associated, of those states whatever states are dissociated... those states are dissociated not from any aggregates, not from any sense bases, from one element.

312. Of states associated with neither-unpleasant-nor-pleasant feeling, whatever states... of states accompanied by equanimity, whatever states are associated, of those states whatever states are dissociated... those states are dissociated not from any aggregates, not from any sense bases, from five elements.

313. Of states with applied and sustained thought, whatever states are associated, of those states whatever states are dissociated... those states are dissociated not from any aggregates, not from any sense bases, from one element.

314. The states that are by consciousness states whatever states... the states that are by mental factor states whatever states... the states that are by states associated with consciousness whatever states... the states that are by states conjoined with consciousness... the states that are by states that originate conjoined with consciousness... the states that are by states that originate conjoined with consciousness and arise together... the states that are by states that originate conjoined with consciousness and follow along whatever states are associated, of those states whatever states are dissociated... those states are dissociated from four aggregates, from one sense base, from seven elements; from one sense base, from one element, dissociated from some.

Four aggregates and one sense base;
Seven among elements and also two from faculties.

Three dependent on, likewise with contact as the fifth;
Decision, attention, three among triads.

Seven intermediate, and two connected with mind;
Applied thought and examining, and equanimous body.

The exposition of the term dissociated by what is associated is seventh.
